






Health

Early Childhood Therapeutic Center (ECTC) Services

Mental health provider agencies are anchors for 3 linked services:


- Mental Health Consultation
 - To staff, teachers, and parents/caregivers at subsidized early care and education (ECE) sites
- Mental Health Treatment
 - To children birth to five, their siblings, and parents/caregivers
- Family Peer Support
 - To parents/caregivers of children birth to five

NYC Model of Consultation

- Funding: ThriveNYC (100% City Tax Levy)
- Consultant: master's level mental health professional with early childhood expertise based in Article 31 clinic
- Site: Subsidized, center-based early care
- Goals: Partnership agreement and joint goal setting
- **Dosage**: 1 day per week for the duration of the year
- **Caseload**: 5 sites, 3 classrooms per site

Three Levels of MHC

Site/Programmatic

• Supports staff in making changes to site's practices and policies that benefit all children and adults in their setting

Classroom

 Conducts classroom observations and works collaboratively with teachers on strategies to respond to the social emotional needs of children in their classroom; Identifies and addresses attitudes, beliefs, practices and conditions


Child and Family

 Helps teachers and parents/caregivers understand and address the individualized needs of children with challenging behaviors


classroom consultation breakdown of

Intensity of Service Depends on Child's Need

Teachers' perceptions of children's behavior: Of the children who received child/family consultation and scored in the "concern" range on the Devereux Early Childhood Assessment (DECA) at the beginning of consultation, **48%** moved to a score of "typical" at the end of consultation.

Connection to clinic treatment: Referrals are made from early care sites and from other sources. 81% of individuals referred from EarlyLearn sites were connected to care (attended appointment at the clinic) vs 63% of individuals referred from other sources.



Teacher feedback survey results, June 2018 (n=279) New Knowledge: As a result of mental health consultation teachers New Skills/Strategies: As a result of mental health consultation reported gaining "a lot" or "some" information in these topics: teachers reported changing "much" or "some" aspects of their practice: 94% 91% 91% 91% 90% 90% Preventing challenging Managing children's Behavior problems in Behavior management Early childhood Considering my own development behaviors in children challenging behaviors feelings and reaction to young children strategies interpersonal interaction during the school day
